Safeguarding/DBS checks

We are continuing to carry out DBS checks for those who need them, so that you can resume your ministries. Thank you very much to those Eucharistic Ministers who have already gone through the process.

If there are any Eucharistic Ministers who have not come forward/who missed the last round, could you please contact the parish office so that we can arrange a mutually convenient date and time to go through everything. This applies equally to those who will minister from the altar as well as those who will take out Communion to the sick or housebound.

We now wish to invite the *Sacristans* to go through the DBS check process (unless you have just gone through it as a Eucharistic Minister). Please contact the parish office to arrange a mutually convenient time to do this. You will need your reading glasses, a black pen, at least 3 pieces of ID one of which must have your date of birth on it and one your current address. Passports, driving licence, birth certificate, bank statement (no older than 3 months), utility bill in your name (no older than 3 months), council tax statement in your name etc are suitable documents, plus your National Insurance number.


