## "No one ever told me that grief felt so like fear. I am not afraid, but the sensation is like being afraid".— C.S. Lewis, A Grief Observed

This week I attended the funeral of a man who I have known all my life, he died suddenly after a fall and the feeling of loss for his wife, children and all who loved him is immense. Death and dying is part of all our story, we experience the loss and heartbreak of people who we love dying, our losing is painful, and death changes us. We are never the same when we lose someone in our life, indeed the whole world is different.

Yet as C.S. Lewis wrote, grief can also feel like fear. It can disable us from seeing beauty and happiness around us, we can feel guilt and regret and all these emotions can be summed up in the word, fear.

As we approach the month of the Holy Souls, we have a solution to our fear and that is prayer. Prayer for those who have died and prayer for ourselves, that when our time is nigh, we shall be ready to face death and dying at peace with God and with our neighbors.

Our faith does not take away the pain of grief, yet it does give us a place to start to look for answers. In Jesus, we see one who experienced death and the pain of dying, indeed a most horrendous death, despised and rejected, yet in Him we see the light beginning to break through the darkness that fear brings – and hope flickers.

Pray for those who have died, for those approaching death today and pray for yourself, that fear gives way to the bright promise of life eternal with Jesus in heaven.

## Gospel of Luke

In November, Saint Wilfrid's will be hosting a series of four sessions exploring the Gospel of Luke, the Gospel we will be hearing from on Sundays next year. These accessible sessions will take place each Wednesday evening in November (see attached poster for further details). As we prepare for the new translation of the scripture readings at Mass from Advent onwards, we are all presented with an opportune chance to discover the scriptures afresh.

Whenever we delve into the bible, we always encounter Christ anew, take my word for it. It was Saint Jerome (342–347) who famously said, "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ". May we all follow Saint Jerome's example and embrace Christ by exploring the Gospel of Luke together. Come along and bring a friend!

#### Readers and the Revised Lectionary

The Lectionary, which is the book that contains the Scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The revised Lectionary will be used in all parishes across England and Wales from the first Sunday in Advent. The new Lectionary will use the English Standard Version - Catholic Edition of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter. These changes are intended to make the texts a more proclaimable and, where appropriate, more inclusive.

To help understand these changes we strongly encourage *all readers* in our parish to come to a formation session on **Monday 11th November** in **St John Fisher's Hall**. Led by Deacon Paul, the evening will start at **7.00pm** with light refreshments and then the formation session from **7.30pm** until **9.00pm**. It is hoped that all our readers would attend but this is open to everyone in the parish.

The revised Lectionary is an important development in our liturgical celebrations, one that is of particular significance for our Readers. Please make every effort to attend. For catering and handout purposes, please pass your name into the parish office.
