Reflection -

"The use of atomic energy for purposes of war is today, more than ever, a crime not only against the dignity of human beings but against any possible future for our common home. How can we speak of peace even as we build terrifying new weapons of war?"

So spoke Pope Francis last November at the Hiroshima Peace Park in Japan.

In 2017, the Pope condemned the 'deterrence strategy' with its constant threats of nuclear war, on which Russia and the U.S. rely for their own defence and the defence of their allies. People, including the U.S. Bishops, had argued that this situation was 'tolerated' not as an end in itself but as a step on the way toward 'progressive disarmament'.

The Pope said a firm 'No' to that argument, and repeated it on a number of occasions, including in addresses to Ambassadors. He meant it.

This week is the 75th. Anniversary of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. I remember, with one of those sharp childhood memories, coming out of the house at home and a man pushing his bike on the opposite pavement shouting: "The Japanese have surrendered. The war is over". I fled inside to tell everybody. Little did I, as an eight-year-old, realise with what horror the war had ended.

And ever since, the world has argued about deterrence and disarmament. Our country, along with most others who have nuclear weapons, has committed itself to nuclear disarmament. And yet we go on rebuilding them. And the superpowers are in yet another nuclear arms race and doing nothing to stop it. Yet it was happening. Both Russia and the U.S. were reducing their stockpile of nuclear weapons.

John Hume, that wonderful Derryman and Nobel Peace Prize winner, who died last week never lost his faith, that the only real peace would be achieved through non-violent dialogue. Through those years of dreadful violence, he remained firm in his profound conviction of this truth. The last few days have been a celebration of that conviction, even as the world mourned his death.

Jesus, Prince of Peace, help us bring your peace to our fragile world.

CHURCH IS OPEN FOR PUBLIC WORSHIP

It has been lovely to welcome people back to church at St Michael's to celebrate together. The numbers are increasing week by week as the news is filtering out and people are confident of the measures, we have put in place to keep them safe.

Please remember that Sunday obligation *has not* been restored. If you are able to please consider attending a midweek mass.

St Bede's will continue to be open for private prayer and the lighting of candles **is** now be allowed.

St Michael's will be open on the following days for Mass:

SUNDAY 9am

SUNDAY 11am

SUNDAY 4:30pm

MONDAY 9:15am

WEDNESDAY 7pm

FRIDAY 9:15am

Please note the church will be open *half an hour* before the Mass starts. This is to allow for controlled and staggered arrival times. Please consider this when making your plans and allow enough time.

PLEASE DO NOT PARK ON THE CHURCH CAR PARK

Funeral services will be at **St. Bede's** on Monday and Friday and **St. Michael's** on Tuesday and Thursday.

Please be aware that this does not mean we are returning to Mass as we knew it before the pandemic. Please view the video from Archbishop Malcolm and look at the leaflet attached to the newsletter *before* you come to Mass. The following points, together with the previous guidelines issued for private prayer, should help you to keep safe and ensure the safety of others.

- You **MUST** wear a face-covering as you enter Church and throughout Mass.
- Please use the hand sanitisers provided as you enter and leave Church.
- If you have a device or missal with text for Mass you may bring this with you.
- A steward will direct you to a seat; people from the same household will be able to sit together.
- Please do not come to Mass with a cough, sneezing or cold symptoms.
- Holy Communion will be given out at the end of Mass.
 - The priest will say "The Body of Christ" and everyone will answer "Amen". There will be no words spoken as you come to receive.
 - A steward will invite each row forward in a pre-determined order. Please wait to be invited before leaving your bench.
 - o Take your face covering down when the person in front of you is receiving.
 - Receive the host in your hand, step to the side, consume the host and then put your face covering back on.
 - o Make your way slowly and reverently out of Church, using the one-way system.

The current situation will remain in place until <u>at least</u> September. We have no plans to re-open any other churches before then. We are starting to offer Baptisms and plans are in place for 1st Holy Communions in September.

We may have to stop offering public worship at very short notice following Archdiocesan and Government advice.

Please see the leaflet sent with the newsletter and watch the video from Archbishop Malcolm outlining what to expect from our new way of celebrating Mass.

Reflection from Fr Joe



As I came out of thirty days of retreat according to the Spiritual Exercises of on July 31st (his Feast Day and my birthday) it was incredible to learn that cafes and restaurants are open once again, and that we can gather for Mass as a parish. Of course, things are not as they were at the start of the year, but there are some welcome changes even though we still need to take care to protect ourselves and each other.

So, the 30-day retreat ended.... What an incredible experience! Very difficult some days, very dry and barren. But other days were full of an incredible joy, tranquillity, and contemplation. And yes... I did manage the whole time in silence without radio, mobile phone, TV, or Internet.

PAPYRUS is the national charity for the prevention of young suicide. We want to smash the stigma surrounding suicide, by making suicide part of the everyday conversation. We do this in three ways: supporting those who are experiencing thoughts of suicide, equipping communities through suicide prevention training and awareness raising, and influencing government policy on a local and national scale.

At HOPELINEUK – PAPYRUS's dedicated suicide prevention helpline – our trained advisers work on a safety plan with young people aged 35 and under who are experiencing thoughts of suicide, to help keep them safe for now.

Our free, confidential phone, text and email service is also for concerned others – that's anybody who might be concerned that a young person may be experiencing thoughts of suicide, and would like to talk about it with one of our suicide prevention advisors.

As well as supporting concerned others and young people who may be experiencing thoughts of suicide, we also offer a debriefing service for professionals – such as GPs, medical staff, first responders and teachers – who may have had a recent encounter with suicide and would like to talk it through with a trained adviser.

#YouAreNotAlone

At home shouldn't mean at risk, but sadly for many people the lockdown has meant that they are trapped in isolation with their abuser under a pressurised situation.

Over the weekend, the Government launched its #YouAreNotAlone domestic abuse campaign to reassure victims of domestic abuse that there is still help for them during the Covid crisis, and that the household isolation instruction as a result of COVID-19 does not apply if you need to leave your home to escape domestic abuse. (Gov.uk, Covid19 and domestic abuse)

- If you are in immediate danger, call 999 and ask for the police the police will continue to respond to emergency calls.
- If you call 999 from a mobile and cannot speak, press 55 to Make Yourself Heard (link embedded to scheme) and this will transfer your call to the police. Pressing 55 only works on mobiles and does not allow police to track your location.
