Have you got some time to give to this new way of being of service in the parish? There is training available. Please contact the Parish Office.

All our churches are open for Mass; children are being baptised; adults have been received into Full Communion with the Catholic Church; children are receiving their First Holy Communion; couples are celebrating their marriage; others the anniversary of their marriage; those who are ill

are receiving the Sacrament of the Sick in their homes and we are celebrating the funerals of our loved ones - all be it with the restrictions that this virus has brought upon us. Fr Mark has been getting into the schools in the parish where our younger children are being educated.

Last Tuesday I visited the Foodbank on Lugsdale Road and discovered a wonderful network of people among which there is a strong Catholic presence: bread is being broken and shared inside and outside the churches. On Thursday afternoon, Mass was celebrated with the Headteachers, Foundation Governors and the RE Co-ordinators from our primary schools and high school: the Word of God is being heard and lived, inside and outside the churches.

CHURCH IS OPEN FOR PUBLIC WORSHIP

Please note that the churches will be open half an hour before Mass starts. This is to allow for controlled and staggered arrival times. Please consider this when making your plans and allow enough time.

CHURCH CAPACITY

Due to social distancing requirements, the maximum number of people allowed in each of our churches is greatly reduced. Once the maximum number has been reached, anyone else who arrives will not be able to enter the building. Our maximum capacities are as follows:

St Michael's 110 St Bede's 68

St John Fisher's 50 St Basil's 60

Please remember that there is currently no obligation to attend Mass. Also, you may consider attending Mass only **one day a week** to make space for others.

If you have any Covid 19 symptoms (i.e. a new, continuous cough) you must not attend church. Also, if you have tested positive for Covid 19 you must not attend church until you have recovered. This is for the safety of others.

We **MUST** wear face-coverings as we enter church and throughout Mass.

- Please use the hand sanitisers provided as you enter and leave church.
- If you have a device or missal with text for Mass you may bring this with you.
- A steward will direct you to a seat.
- Holy Communion will be given out at the end of Mass.
 - A steward will invite each row forward in a pre-determined order.

Please wait to be invited before leaving your bench.

- Take your face covering down when the person in front of you is receiving.
- Receive the host in your hand, step to the side, consume the host and then put your face covering back on.
- o Make your way slowly and reverently out of church, using the one-way system.

We may have to stop offering public worship at very short notice following Archdiocesan and Government advice.

Please note that the doors have to remain open during Mass to ensure adequate ventilation. This means it may be colder than we would like. Please wear a coat.

CONFESSIONS

Confessions currently take place in St Bede's church from **11.00am to 12.00 noon** on a Saturday. As you enter church you will be asked to sanitise your hands and will be directed to a place by one of the stewards. We ask you to remain in your place until one of the priests is available, when the steward will invite you forward. One priest will be at the back of the sanctuary and another in the Blessed Sacrament chapel. There will be a Perspex screen between the penitent and the priest, and we ask that you remain standing during your confession.

Once you have received absolution please leave the church immediately via the side aisle and pray your penance as you make your way home. However, if you wish to spend some time before the Blessed Sacrament, please re-enter the church through the main door, sanitise your hands, and tell the steward you are wanting to pray.

You must wear a face covering at all times whilst in church.

Fr Joe

Fr Joe will be leaving the parish next month and will speak at all the Masses on 21st/22nd November, which will be his last weekend with us.

Fr Joe has received confirmation that he will be working in the Diocese of Sicuani, which is in the mountains about two hours' drive from the city of Cuzco. He will be flying to Peru on 6th January.

When a priest leaves a parish, it is usual for us to have the opportunity to express our gratitude and have a farewell celebration. "Fr Joe Testimonial" envelopes will be available at the back of all our churches which can either be placed on the collection, handed in to the Parish Office, or through the letter box of any of the presbyteries. Alternatively, you can use your own envelopes, but please ensure you write "Fr Joe Testimonial" on the outside.

Due to the impact of the recent Covid restrictions the Mass for Fr Joe and Fr Michael, that was due to take place in the Cathedral, will take place at 7pm on Tuesday 3 November in St Michael's, Ditton. As you are aware there is a limit to the capacity in the church and those who wish to attend must book a place by contacting the Parish Office – 0151 422 1772. Thank you for your understanding.
