#### **Psalm Response** 'The Lord is my light and my salvation'

# Go to Joseph

On Wednesday, we take a break from Lent, as we venerate St Joseph. According to our Catholic tradition, there are four levels of 'reverence'. The first is 'latria' which means 'adoration' or 'worship' and is the reverence we reserve to God-the Holy Trinity, alone. So, when we genuflect before the Tabernacle, when we bow to the Altar, or when we go to adoration, that's 'latria'. The second level is 'hyperdulia', which means 'hyper-veneration' and is the special reverence we have for the Virgin Mary as the Mother of God. After that there is 'protodulia', which means 'first veneration', the reverence we have for St Joseph, who as the earthly father of the Christ, enjoys a premier place among the saints. The last is 'dulia', the reverence we have for the rest of the saints, whom we venerate as the friends of God.

From this we can see two truths. Firstly, despite what many protestants and others declare, we do not worship the Virgin Mary or the saints. Our tradition tells us that we only worship God, while we venerate the saints. Secondly, it shows us just how important St Joseph is.

We would do well to give him 'first veneration' after Mary. In 1870, Pope Pius IX declared St Joseph to be the 'Universal Patron of the Church'. Thus, Joseph is our patron, YOUR patron. Go to him! I can't begin to tell you how much I love St Joseph. He is my unfailing helper, protector and advocate. There have been many occasions in my life, when St Joseph has just 'sorted things out'. Let me tell you, if you pray to Joseph, you will not be left unaided. So, do come along to Mass next Wednesday morning and seek his intercession. He is so close to Our Lord and will whisper your request into the ear of the Child Jesus. May St Joseph, our holy protector and advocate, intercede for us, the Church, his Holy Family on earth today.
