Although there is much to commend in St Wilfrid's, it always unsafe to stand still as a parish. It seems that St Wilfrid's never 'stands still', and this is a good thing. There is a 'hunger' to improve, to do better, to adapt and reform according to the changing times. Thinking about these things, here are some points of reflection.

- **Welcome**. How effective are we at welcoming people of all races, abilities, ages etc., at welcoming new members and at encouraging each other to invite others to events?
- **Inclusivity.** How inclusive are we? Could we do better to create opportunities for all to participate in ministry and liturgical roles?
- Support. Could we do better and more to support the needs of our community, including the sick, homebound, and elderly?
- **Charity.** Are there new or urgent charitable causes that we should be supporting?
- **Evangelisation**. How well do we reach out to people who are not currently active in the church?
- **Unity and diversity**. We are enriched by the unity and diversity of our parish community, who each have different gifts to offer. How well do we engage this wealth of skills and talent?
- Youth ministry. How well are we engaging young people in the celebration of Mass and in other parish activities?

Every one of us has a role to play to keep our parish community vibrant. Might you action one of the points above this week?
