Psalm Response

'To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul'.

It is impossible to live a mature Christian life without frequent confession...

Friends, we all need to go to confession. It is as simple as that. While Advent is a season of 'joyful expectation', it is also season of preparation. We prepare to meet God by turning our backs on sin. Hence why, during advent, the priest and deacon wear violet vestments (the liturgical colour of penance). Now, no one in this parish is perfect. Yet, if we were to take the numbers coming to confession on first Saturday as an indication of the spiritual state of our parish, we would be led to believe that Widnes is a town of saints! How wrong we would be.

A wise friend once said to me, "in any church, the line for confession should be as long as the line for communion". We all have our own perception of the sacrament of God's pardon. Nevertheless, our perception does not change our absolute necessity to receive it.

We all need God's forgiveness, no matter how 'good' we are. Indeed, as Saint Pio of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio) once said, "*Confession is the soul's bath. Even a clean and unoccupied room gathers dust: return after a week and you will see that it needs dusting again.*" I speak for myself in saying that I need a frequent 'dusting'. I am a sinner. Not one of us knows the time when the good Lord will call us from this life. While God is a merciful judge, he is no fool.

If we refuse his mercy in this life, how can we expect to receive it in the next? We need to respond to the call. If we have anxieties about going to confession, or if we feel indifferent towards it, we can take inspiration from the Lord's words in the Gospel reading today, "*Straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.*" (Luke 21:28). In confession, we will encounter a personal God, who yearns to hear our sorrows and graciously forgive.

So, folks, let us stand up and be brave in asking for forgiveness.

Each year we have an Advent appeal for a worthy cause, this year the cause is very close to home; our own Catholic schools here in Widnes. I have often said that our schools are the pride of our parish, and they are more than that, they are missionary outposts, 'other' churches in our community and often the first point of contact for those who do not know what to do or where to go with a 'church' related matter.

As we all know, things change and the liturgical life and RE curriculum in our schools is constantly being reviewed and changed, as it should be, so that our children receive a wonderful experience of God and His kingdom, that is always fresh and new. This year, I suggest that we offer a gift to the children in our own parish and provide religious resources and experiences that they would not otherwise be able to afford from their own RE school budget.

Some ideas that the schools might choose...

Good News Bibles that are accessible and attractive for all the children.

A crucifix for the chapel at St. Peter and Paul or a moveable altar for Mass in the College.

The cost of buses so that our children can go on retreat.

Resources to make RE lessons come alive.

The headteachers with the RE coordinator would choose what they need in their particular school and report back to the parish community on what they have spent the appeal money on.

If you would like to be part of the Advent Appeal this year, please pass your donation on an envelope marked '**ADVENT APPEAL**' into the Parish Office or into the offertory bags at Mass. The money will then be split between the schools in the parish in the new year. So often we buy things at Christmas for people who don't need anything, perhaps this year we could give this gift of knowledge about Jesus to the smallest people in our parish community.
