#### OUR LADY OF OERPETUAL SUCCOUR, WIDNES

It is just over 6 years since Our Lady's Church ceased to be a place of worship in St Wilfrid's Parish. The building was used as a Pastoral Centre; a gathering place for parish and community activities. The presbytery has been unoccupied since 2010 and its condition has deteriorated to such an extent that it would need significant spending to make it habitable or to convert to alternative use. The Parish Centre has ceased to trade as a licensed premises because of the pandemic. The John Dalton Centre has provided another meeting space for the parish and local community. Following a review of the buildings, and in the light of the financial impact of the pandemic on the parish, the Trustees of the Archdiocese have taken the decision to demolish all the buildings on the site. The various parish and community groups have been informed of this decision and have been offered alternative accommodation within the present stock of parish properties in St Wilfrid's Parish.
