'You are a priest for ever, according to the order of Melchizedek'.

What are war and peace?

The news is full of awful accounts of war, especially in the Middle East, Ukraine and Russia. The horror of these situations is undeniable. They have caused me to reflect on what we understand as war and peace.

The Catholic Church has a profound and multifaceted understanding of war and peace, shaped by centuries of theological reflection, social teaching, and historical experiences. One of the early Church Fathers, St. Augustine, argued that war can be morally justified under certain conditions. Importantly, he drew a clear distinction between just and unjust war and had a clear focus on the necessity and proportionality of response. These moral implications remain points of debate and contention in our modern world.

Peace can be both positive and negative. It is negative in that it is the absence of war and positive in the sense that it is the absence of the causes of war. Albert Einstein, the famous scientist and peace activist believed that peace can only be achieved by an honest attempt to create mutual trust.

Pope Leo XIV recently stated that authentic peace "takes shape from the ground up" when the differences and conflicts they entail "are not set aside but acknowledged, understood, and surmounted." A year before this statement, Pope Francis said that building peace begins by "standing alongside victims, seeing things from their point of view."

Perhaps when we read the news of the many conflicts going on in our world, we might consider the victims, the protagonists and their arguments using the 'lens' of these understandings of war and peace? Then we can pray for global healing, asking for grace to mend broken relationships and restore peace in parts of the world suffering conflict.

DBS Rechecks for St Wilfrid's Parish Roles and SVP Members

The Archdiocesan Safeguarding Team has now given us the go ahead to do DBS rechecks for those people whose parish role necessitates them having a DBS check, and whose previous DBS check was done before twelve months ago. We have a tight timescale for this so we would appreciate your full cooperation to ensure they are done within this timeframe. This applies to Eucharistic Ministers, Chaperones, SVP members, Catechists, Sacristans, Altar Servers over the age of 16, Children's Liturgy Leaders, Knights of St Columba and people in certain roles for Lourdes trips.

All applicants must bring with them 3 documents proving their identity, for verification by the parish safeguarding team. Examples of evidence are:- a current passport, a UK birth certificate issued soon after the birth, a photo card driving licence, a bank statement issued within the last 3 months (an online one is not acceptable), a utility bill issued within the last 3 months (again an online one is not acceptable) – these must have a current address on them, a council tax bill/statement issued within the last 12 months or a marriage certificate. One of the documents must have a date of birth on it and you cannot bring more than one of each type.

If you have an email address you will complete a DBS 3c form, a written agreement form and a code of conduct, plus provide the 3 ID documents. If you do not have an email address you will complete a DBS 4, DBS 17 and DBS 3a form, as well as a written agreement form and a code of conduct, plus provide the 3 ID documents.

Sessions for the rechecks will be at the Parish Office on **Monday 30**th **June 2 – 4pm** for Catechists and Sacristans; **Wednesday 2**nd **July 6 – 8pm** for Eucharistic Ministers and Chaperones; **Saturday 5**th **July 12 noon to 1.30pm** for Knights of St Columba, Lourdes staff and Altar Servers over the age of 16. Thank you in anticipation of your cooperation.

A current DBS is essential, without one, you are unable to continue in your ministry at any level.
