

#### **Psalm Response**

'The Lord is compassionate and gracious'

### 'Full of Grace'

On Tuesday, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord. We will be present to the moment, as we consider Jesus incarnate in the womb of Mary.

Now, in the Bible, when someone is given a mission, they often get a new name. In Genesis 17:1–5, Abram is renamed 'Abraham' (which means 'father of a multitude') as he receives his mission to be our father in faith. A few verses later, his wife Sarai is renamed 'Sarah' (which means 'princess') in light of her important status as a matriarch. In Genesis 32:28, after physically wrestling with God, Jacob is renamed 'Israel' (which means 'he wrestles with God') as he receives the same promise afforded to Abraham. In Numbers 13:16, Hoshea is renamed 'Joshua' (which means 'the LORD is salvation') in light of his role as successor to Moses. In 2 Samuel 12:24-25, the young Solomon is given the name 'Jedediah' (which means 'beloved of the Lord') as the destined King of Israel. In the New Testament, in Matthew 16:13-20, Simon is renamed 'Peter' (which means 'rock') in light of his future mission as the first Pope.

When the Angel Gabriel announces to Mary that she is to be the Mother of God, it could be said that she receives a new name too. Some would argue, that the special word used by the Angel to address Mary, is in fact a new name. Following the tradition of the People of Israel, the greek word; 'kecharitomene' (which means 'one who is and always was full of grace') could be a new name for Mary. For the reason that she was chosen by God, even before she was born, but also for the reason she physically bore God in her womb, she is 'full of grace'. As 'Daughter of Zion', and the new 'Ark of the Covenant' she stands in the tradition of Israel. Mary's exalted status is tied to the person of her Son. She reflects Jesus Christ, like a mirror, to us. She is not grace itself, but is rather filled with Grace, filled with the love of God. May the same grace of God be poured out upon us afresh! Mary, Full of Grace - pray for us!

### St Bede's Garden Update

Volunteers have been busy over the winter restoring the grounds. Trenches dug to preserve the walls from tree roots. Shrubbery removed and ground levelled. Trees prunes and planted and borders realigned and laws extended and edged. Tree stumps removed and 230 hollies planed around the perimeter. Logs cut from trees will benefit wildlife with birdboxes erected. Chicken wire fixed to fences to reduce litter. Wildflowers and ornamentals planted for year-round colour. This project will reduce workload enhancing St Bede's. Thank you to all who give of their time to benefit us all.

#### **Chrism Mass**

The Chrism Mass is an annual event when the Archbishop, the priests and the people gather in the Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King – it is an occasion when we see the Church in the Archdiocese of Liverpool united. At this Mass the Sacred Oils that are used throughout the Archdiocese throughout this year, are blessed and the priests renew their promises of ordination.

We shall organise a coach to take us to the Cathedral, it will leave St. Bede's Church at **6pm** on **Wednesday 16**<sup>th</sup> **April** and return around 10pm.
