The international Organisation for Migration is just seventy years old and Pope Francis, as you would expect,

sent a strong birthday message about migrants and migration, mentioning in particular those who died so tragically in the Channel, those stuck in terrible conditions on the borders of Belarus and those who have died crossing the Mediterranean Sea.

"The fundamental lack of human respect across national borders diminishes us all in our humanity".

I suspect that there was such a feeling here after the Channel disaster but wonder how much it changed hearts in regard to the treatment of migrants in our country. It hit home quite hard when the Pope said: Most people who can live decently in their country of origin would not feel compelled to migrate irregularly.

Urgent efforts are needed to create better social and economic conditions so that migration is not the only option for those seeking peace, justice, security and full respect for human dignity.

What hit home was the fact that we have reduced our Overseas Development contribution from the U.N. requested 0.7% of gross national income to 0.5%, which is a very significant drop in a contribution of which a major part would go precisely to what Pope Francis is talking about. We were one of the few countries giving the full amount, and all recent British Governments have agreed to that until now.

And the Pope speaks of the riches that migrants bring to their welcoming country: Migrants make visible the bond that unites the entire human family, the richness of cultures and the resources for developing the exchanges and trade networks that make up the diaspora communities.

And Pope Francis promised that the Catholic Church and its institutions will continue its mission of welcoming, protecting, promoting and integrating people on the move.

#### ST. BEDE'S CLUB - WIDNES FOODBANK

Following the decision of the Archdiocese to close St Bede's Club Bishop Tom Neylon approached Widnes Foodbank to ascertain whether it could use the club premises for its purposes.

Widnes Foodbank decided that by undertaking some alterations the club premises could be made into a very suitable food storage warehouse and on 12<sup>th</sup> November 2021 entered into a lease of the club premises from the Archdiocese.

Over the next few months alterations will be made to the club premises to make it suitable for use as a food storage warehouse.

When this alteration work is completed the club premises will become the main warehouse of Widnes Foodbank. Widnes Foodbank will also retain its existing warehouse at Cemetery Lodge.

Due to an increase in the number of clients and an increase in the amount of food donations Widnes Foodbank is seeking to recruit additional volunteers to:-use their own vehicles to collect food from the donation points and deliver it to the warehouse and then transport food from the warehouse to the distribution centres; work in the warehouse weighing, sorting, dating and storing food donations; and work in the food distribution centres distributing food to the clients.

#### St. Wilfrid's Advent Appeal – 2021

So often we buy gifts for people who don't really need them! Socks and scarves that are very nice but not really needed! As Christians we are called to see Advent as a real time of waiting in hope, a time of reflection and prayer and a time of showing our faith in caring for those in need. This year we are going to help asylum seekers, refugees, and vulnerable migrants by giving them a gift that IS desperately needed. All items must be NEW as they are a Christmas gift. If you would like to buy a gift, you simply take a 'Christmas Label' from the back of Church, with an item that is needed and return it with the label attached. This stops us all buying the same things! Gifts can be left (please do not wrap them) at the back of all the churches during Advent. (Last date for donations is Sunday 19th December) Men's underwear – sizes small and medium, Socks – sizes 6 – 12, Warm hats, gloves, and scarves (male and female) Training shoes – male sizes 6 – 10, Women's underwear – sizes 10 – 16 Small electrical items – toaster, kettles, blender, juicer (if the receipt could be attached to these items it would be a great help), Small and medium pans, Pillows, and pillowcases. #### Blessing of Our Lady's Grotto at St Michael's Church

The original Grotto was built by Lawrence Fraser to celebrate the 21<sup>st</sup> anniversary of Our Lady's Church and was presented to Fr David O'Kelly on 3<sup>rd</sup> November 1980, the priest who founded the parish and built the church. To ensure that he had the dimensions correct, Lol built the inner section of the Grotto in his garden with his wife, Joan, standing in for Our Lady. The Grotto set the scene for many May crowning ceremonies for the school children and the start of our Whit-Sunday walks. Over the years the Grotto has become a special place for parishioners, children, visitors, dog walkers, in fact for anyone who was just passing by and wanted to say a prayer, or a hello, to Our Lady: it was the perfect place for a little quiet contemplation.

At the beginning of 'lockdown' a small group of parishioners began to meet each Friday afternoon to say the Rosary – fortunately, the weather that first year was perfect, and praying in the sunshine was a little bit special. Circumstances recently changed and it was decided to relocate the Grotto to St Michael's church garden. Who better to rebuild the Grotto than Stephen Fraser, Lol's son? Using many of the stones from Our Lady's Grotto, Stephen has blended those stones with the sandstone walls of St Michael's, and the Grotto looks as if it has always been there – it looks at home. The Rosary Circle continues to meet each week and invites you all to attend St Michael's church on Thursday December 9<sup>th</sup> when the Grotto will be blessed before the mid-day Mass in celebration of Our Lady's feast of the Immaculate Conception on 8th December .
