THE FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

I went for a walk last Saturday morning. It had been snowing the night before and it was icy when I left the presbytery. As I was heading home the sun was helping the ice to thaw. I met an elderly man on the pavement and stood back in an opening so that we could keep our distance as he passed by. I said to him: 'Have you managed to stay on your feet?' He answered cheerfully that he had and that he was wearing an old pair of football boots with screw-in studs! His hard-won experience of playing on muddy or icy football pitches many years ago was still to the good.

In today's gospel Jesus encounters a man, in the synagogue in Capernaum, with an unclean spirit. The spirit recognises Jesus for who he really is: '- the Holy One of God.' Jesus rebukes him, saying: "Be silent, and come out of him!". Like the man I met last Saturday morning, Jesus' hard-won experience of temptation by Satan in the wilderness was still to the good, when he encountered the evil spirits. When we say 'No' to temptation, we do so with the strength that comes from our unity with Christ in his battle against evil.

LENT and EASTER 2021

Unfortunately, we do not know, at this stage, what we will be able to offer for Lent and Easter 2021. Please be assured that we will do our very best.

Ash Wednesday 17th February 2021 – we will be opening each of our churches to offer a 'walk through' option to receive the ashes.

St Bede's 7:30 am – 8:30 am St Basil's 10am – 11 am St John Fisher 12noon -1pm St Michael's 6pm – 7pm



Stewards will invite you to enter the church, where the priest will *scatter* the ashes *on* your head. You will then be directed to leave by another door. You will receive a prayer/examination of conscience/prayer of sorrow card.

You will have to maintain strict social distancing of 2 meters at all times. There will not be any opportunity to stop and sit in the churches.



This year we will be offering an opportunity to purchase an Easter Lily in memory of a loved one. The cost will be £5 and the lily will be displayed in one of our churches at the Easter Vigil on Saturday evening. The names of the deceased will be displayed in all our churches.

This is a new incentive which will allow us to fill our churches with flowers and will help to defray the cost. We have had such a loss of income during the pandemic which is now approaching a full year and we must look at creative ways to boost our income and keep our churches looking special.
