Reflection.

One of the most important movements with young people of my generation was the YCW (Young Christian Workers), which had an offshoot in the YCS (Young Christian Students).

Founded in Belgium in 1912-13 by a young priest called Joseph Cardin, it sought better working conditions for the young, but, more importantly, to give young people a renewed sense of personal dignity as sisters and brothers of Jesus.

The first YCW group in England was in 1937 in Wigan. Its chaplain was Fr. Gerry Rimmer and its first President a young factory worker called Patrick Keegan. Patrick went on to work with Fr. Cardin, later made a Cardinal by Pope Paul VI, and Patrick became the first layperson to address an Ecumenical Council, speaking at Vatican II on the apostolate of the laity.

YCW worked on the "See, Judge, Act" process. It worked with small groups, took a situation which needed to be addressed at the work of the youngsters, looked carefully at it (See), held it up to the light of the Gospel (Judge), and decided in view of that what they should do to have it rectified (Act).

Some of my best times as a young priest were working with young people in the YCW.

All of that by way of introduction to Pope Francis' new book, "Let us dream", The Path to A Better Future. Described as Pope Francis in conversation with Austen Ivereigh, it is Pope Francis' See, Judge and Act about the present situation of our world. And it is wonderful.

Austen Ivereigh is a British author and journalist who has written two biographies of Pope Francis. The book is very readable, not too long, just 144 pages, and essentially has three chapters, not called See, Judge and Act, but that is what they are:

A time to see, A time to choose, A time to act.

It would be good to read it! Published by Simon and Schuster at £10.99. But in case that does not happen I plan, God willing, to take the three parts for Reflection in the next three Newsletters...
