### An Advent Odyssey

Homer's *Odyssey*, the great ancient poem of the 8th century BC, follows the story of Odysseus, the mythical king of Ithaca. Spoiler alert: after a war, Odysseus embarks upon a long spiritual quest to find his way home and in doing so, wages against other worldly forces, strange monsters and natural disasters. It is from this ancient poem that the word 'Odyssey' originates. An Odyssey is more than a simple commute from A to B, it is an adventure, a long spiritual quest.

These days, clergy often speak of 'journeys'. We've all heard them. "Our Lenten journey", "our Easter journey", "our Synodal journey", "our Advent journey". But to me, a 'journey' has always implied a mundane movement (going to the shops) and not a transformative and transcendent encounter with the living God! The word I prefer for spiritual movements is 'Odyssey'. As opposed to a journey, an Odyssey always involves the transcendent, aka; God.

So, I reckon our whole life should be an 'Advent Odyssey'. According to St Bernard of Clairvaux, there are three 'advents' or 'comings' of Christ. His coming as a baby two thousand years ago, His coming in spirit here and now through the sacraments and His coming in judgement at the end of time. In light of this, we see that life should be a long Advent Odyssey, one of seeking and preparation. Christ is always on the way to us (an Advent) and we ought to be searching for Him (an Odyssey). Like Homer, we will encounter wondrous things, behold terrific sights and meet ourselves head on. Above all, the end of our quest will be God.

However, we have to embark upon the Odyssey. We need to search high and low, our whole lives. God is always on the way to us, we need to be poised to meet, ready to encounter Him in the strangest of places. More often than not, He is right under our noses.

## Safeguarding - DBS Renewal for Volunteers

The Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) is currently improving how the Update Service works for its volunteer subscribers. The improvements will allow volunteers who are subscribed to the Update Service to **confirm whether they wish to remain subscribed to the service to keep their Standard and Enhanced DBS certificates up to date.**

From Sunday 8 December 2024, subscribers to the Update Service will be emailed 30 days before their renewal date to ask if they wish to stay subscribed. Renewal dates are based on original joining dates. In preparation for this change, DBS advises volunteers to check that the email address attached to their subscription is linked to the individual who is subscribed.

The renewal email will ask volunteers to access their Update Service Account and confirm that they wish to continue with the service. For those who confirm, this request will be repeated annually. If no confirmation is made, their volunteer subscription will automatically be cancelled.

Volunteers who do not renew their subscription will not be able to keep their DBS certificate(s) up to date and organisations will not be able to check them. They will need to reapply for a DBS check if they need one in the future.

If you would like to renew you need to access your Update Service Account and confirm that you would like to keep your DBS up to date.
