Reflection

During his earthly life Christ essentially did three things: he taught us, he guided us, and he offered a sacrifice for us. These are Christ's three great offices through which our redemption is realised: his teaching office, his pastoral office, and his priestly or sacerdotal office. They're highlighted in St. John's gospel when Jesus tells us "I am the way (pastoral office), the truth (teaching office), and the life (sacerdotal office)" (Jn. 14: 6).

Now the essence of priesthood is to offer sacrifice to God and given Christ did precisely that through his death on the cross, then Christ is a priest - our high-priest in fact - and his death is part of his sacerdotal office.

Of course, Christ's sacrifice was unique. It wasn't merely a case of a good man giving up his life for his friends - no matter how impressive that is. While Christ did give up his life for his friends, he did more than that. First, Christ gave up his life for the entire human race - all of us. Second, as well as being human, Christ was also fully and truly God. So when Christ gave up his earthly life on the cross the value of his sacrifice was greater than any merely human sacrifice. As a result, not only did Christ's sacrifice atone for the faults and failings of every human being who has ever lived or who will live - all of us, it also merited that God the Father reward Christ and the rest of the human race subsequently through Christ. What reward? Well for Christ himself: resurrection, transfiguration of the body and ascension into heaven. And for us through Christ: all the supernatural graces God offers us.

This has two very important consequences. First, every human being receives the grace necessary for salvation. Whether we avail of it or not is a matter of our own free choice. Second, whatever grace we can receive is a consequence of Christ's sacrificial death. And to the extent we do receive that grace, we ourselves participate in Christ's death.

If you are paying by direct debit, then there will be no envelopes for you unless you have specifically requested a set.


There are a limited number of blank envelopes for non-taxpayers who still want to use an envelope.
