Responsorial Psalm

R. You are my refuge, O Lord; you fill me with the joy of salvation.

To continue from last week.... it is very important to remember that criticism of the Israeli Government's politics is not the same as anti-semitism, which is to be totally condemned.

Political Zionism appeared towards the end of the nineteenth century, under the leadership of Theodor Herzl. Its first congress was called in 1897 in Basel. A nationalist movement, its aim was the establishment of a homeland for the Jewish people in Palestine. At this time,

Jewish communities were scattered across Europe, mainly in big cities, and by no means always welcome. Zionism encouraged migration to Palestine.

The first great power encouragement of the Zionist movement came from Britain in 1917 with the Balfour Declaration, a short letter from the Foreign Secretary to Lord Rothschild...

"His Majesty's Government view with favour the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people and will use their best endeavours to facilitate the achievement of this object, it being clearly understood that nothing shall be done which may prejudice the civil and religious rights of existing non-Jewish communities in Palestine,".

The statistics I can find say that at that time Palestinian Arabs were 93% of the population and Jewish people 7%. And Palestine at the time came under Turkey, not Britain.

After WW1, The League of Nations gave Britain the mandate to administer Palestine. During this period, the Zionists continued their pressure towards a Jewish homeland, immigration continued, and Arab grievances increased. Towards the end of the WW2, dreadful violence broke out.

In 1947, Britain pulled out and left it to the new United Nations, which proposed the two state solution. Israel self-declared itself a state, but the Palestinian state has never come into being. Over the following years, through a series of wars, Israel has come to have territorial control of the whole of Palestine and, with its illegal settlements, to actually take over huge tracts of the country. At the same time, as a result of Israeli pressure, military and other, there are about six million Palestinian refugees, 2.4 million of them in Jordan, huge numbers in Gaza and in the West Bank. Chile has half a million.
