Reflection

This week we want to discuss Christ's resurrection and the best way to begin is to clarify what we mean by it. Let's note straight away, when we speak of Christ's resurrection, we don't mean Christ was resuscitated. Resuscitation pertains to living people who are unconscious; dead people can't be resuscitated. Christ, however, truly and really died on the cross. On the cross Christ's soul was separated from his body. Christ's death was a true death in every sense of the term. So, resuscitation was not an option for Christ and hence it is not what we mean when we speak of Christ's resurrection.

Nor, however, do we mean Christ just came back to life after he had died. Certainly, this did happen - as it did to Lazarus as well (Jn. 11:1-44) - but crucially, this wasn't all that happened to Christ. Because when Christ rose from the dead he rose to eternal life; he would never die again. Lazarus, on the other hand, would die again. So when we speak of Christ's resurrection, we mean Christ's body being reunited with his soul in such a way that they would never be separated again. Christ rose to eternal life, and this was something completely new in history.

Still if that's what we mean by Christ's resurrection why was it necessary and how did it affect us? Here we have to be careful. Christ's resurrection was only necessary because Christ died on the cross. If God the Father had chosen another way to bring about our salvation, then his Son's resurrection wouldn't have been necessary. But given what actually happened - given Christ's sacrifice on the cross - then Christ merited his resurrection together with the transfiguration of his body, his ascension into heaven, and all the other graces the Father bestowed on him. So Christ's resurrection was necessary in that sense.

But how did it affect us? Well, first, it confirms our belief that Christ was divine. After all, if Christ hadn't been raised, then there would be no reason to believe he was anything other than a good man. And there would certainly be no reason to think he had conquered death, overcome sin, and opened the way to eternal life. Second, it offers us legitimate hope of future glory. If Christ is raised to eternal glory and we are united to Christ, then we also can hope for future glory in heaven with Christ. Third, it confirms that we should imitate Christ's way of life. If Christ who lived in the way he did was raised to eternal life, then we who also want to be raised to eternal life should try to behave in the same way. Finally, and most importantly, it causes the resurrection of our bodies. Christ's resurrection came first, our resurrection will follow. The divine power which reunited Christ's body and soul will flow from Christ to all of us at the general resurrection of the dead. As a result, our bodies will also be inseparably reunited with our souls and Christ will reward us all with our just deserts.
