A Gift of the Holy Spirit

It was a typical Cardinal Vincent memory. He recalled being at a religious service where the Queen was present. Everybody was glued to their service booklet, reciting a long prayer. +Vincent glanced up and saw the Queen, eyes closed, reciting the prayer by heart.

Archbishop Justin Welby commented that the Queen could not understand why other people did not pray as she did. Somebody, I forget who, said that Geoffrey Fisher, Archbishop of Canterbury at the time of the Coronation, prepared a series of reflections for her on her future role. She studied them carefully.

The former Archbishop of Canterbury, Roman Williams, has written an article about Anointing at the Coronation, 'Queen Elizabeth, Servant of God'. He notes that the image of the anointed monarch pervades Scripture. So, the title 'Christ', the Anointed One', our Saviour. Anointing at Baptism or Ordination, signifies that someone is being given a new place in the community of God's people. It is not a job description, he adds, nor is it a blank cheque for power and privilege. It creates a relationship with God and with the community of faith and promises grace to make that relationship live and thrive.

...."And this is what the royal anointing means at its most important level - a gift of the Holy Spirit to hold a fragile human person in faithfulness to this place where community can gather for restoration and renewal. And there is no doubt at all that this was exactly what Queen Elizabeth believed about her role. It was a vocation for which she had been blessed and graced, and anointing was at the heart of it.

What does all of that say to me as a baptised /anointed person in this community of faith? It is a powerful thought.
