

## **Appeal for Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist**

We need more Eucharistic Ministers. We need more ministers to take Holy Communion to the sick and housebound and we need more ministers to serve at Holy Mass, offering the Body and Blood of Jesus to our fellow parishioners. We are literally at capacity, any new requests for Holy Communion at home will have to be placed on a waiting list as we have no one to offer them the sacrament at home. To be clear, Holy Communion can be taken to the sick on any day and the sick are so grateful to receive Jesus and know that they are not forgotten by the community. In October, Fr. Peter will begin to celebrate Mass in the nursing homes in the parish and will offer the Sacrament of the Sick to those who require it. Also Fr. Mark and Fr. Peter cover Whiston Hospital overnight to offer spiritual comfort to the dying and the bereaved.

## Could you help? Yes, you, not the person sitting next to you! Could you volunteer for this wonderful ministry in our community?

If you would like to know the commitment that is required for either role, please pass your name and telephone number into the Parish Office and Pauline Rolt will contact you. All necessary safeguarding procedures will be followed before your appointment is made as a minister and training will be given. Please think about it.

## **Liturgy Notes**

#### **Readers**

- 1. End each of the readings with 'THE WORD OF THE LORD' not 'This is the Word of the Lord'.
- 2. At the psalm, after a pause, simply read the response without introduction.
- 3. Move into your place for the intercessions at the line, 'I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church', in the Creed.

#### **Eucharistic Ministers**

- 1. When approaching the altar, come up *together* at the Sign of Peace, bow to the altar *together* and then move to your places. Take your time, there is no rush.
- 2. Once *all* ministers have received the host from the priest, move and take either the bowl or the chalice without receiving from the chalice, and move into your place without delay If there is any Precious Blood over at the end, you shall receive then.
- 3. Do not purify the sacred vessels during Mass, simply leave them covered with the purificator on the credence table and immediately after Mass come back up on the altar and purify. If you are going out with Holy Communion to the sick, the minister who is available should purify the vessels. The purification of the vessels is the responsibility of the Eucharistic Minister not the sacristan.
- 4. Then please, come to the front of the altar, wait until all ministers are there, bow to the altar *together* and then return to your place.
