#### Psalm Response: 'The Lord upholds my life'

### A new feast day...

Earlier this year, the Vatican gave approval for the annual liturgical celebration of Our Lady of Walsingham to be elevated to a Feast Day in England. This is great news for our country! From now on, Mass on the 24th of September will include the recitation of the Gloria and special prayers in honour of Our Lady of Walsingham. The only celebration above a Feast in the liturgy is a Solemnity. Some notable Solemnities include Easter Day, Christmas Day and within our own parish, Saint Wilfrid's Day, as he is our principal patron. Interesting fact: all Sundays in the year are also Solemnities!

The story of Walsingham began in the year 1061, when Lady Richeldis de Faverches, a holy noble woman, underwent a series of religious ecstasies, including a visit back in time to home of the Holy Family at Nazareth (Doctor Who eat your heart out). Our Lady requested that Richeldis build a replica of the house at Nazareth, so that pilgrims could seek her intercession in Walsingham. This she did and it is said that angels assisted her in finishing the Holy House. So it was that Walsingham grew to prominence as 'England's Nazareth' and thus the once insignificant Norfolk village, became one of the great pilgrimage centres of the world. Many Kings and Queens of England visited the Shrine, including King Henry VIII, who, upon founding the Church of England because he wanted a new wife, destroyed the Shrine and ordered the Statue of Our Lady of Walsingham to be burned at Chelsea in 1538. As a result, Walsingham returned to insignificance, until 1896, when another pious woman, Charlotte Pearson Boyd, purchased and restored the then ruined medieval 'Slipper Chapel' just outside of Walsingham, thereby re-establishing Catholic devotion to Our Lady in the area. The same ancient Chapel was created a Minor Basilica by Pope Francis in 2015 and serves as our National Shrine of Our Lady.

This parish has a long association with the Shrine and by God's grace, some of us we will be journeying there later this year. May she pray for us and for our troubled world.

## **Restoration Update**

Hard hats, high viz jackets and boots where the order of the day when accompanied by Peter McCann and the architects I ascended the ladders to view the progress so far on the restoration of the St Bede's Church. As you can see the scaffolding is now finished right to the top of the church on all sides. It has taken a while but is worth it to ensure safety and to ensure that the whole exterior of the church can be restored in one go!

Despite the odd pigeon flying out at me from concealed corners the visit went well. The slates are not in too bad a condition. What is an issue are the weak points. The pointing, the flashings, bad repairs carried out in the past. When on top of the roof the poor state of the gutters and buildup of silt etc. show what the water is coming into the church.

What was an even bigger issue was the state of the large sandstone window above the high altar, it was literally crumbling in my hands as I touched it. The architect said it was returning to beach!! I.e. going back to sand.

Fortunately, however, the plan was to replace the window, so I do not need to worry when saying Mass that the beach might come crumbling down around me in the future.

I am pleased to report that the project is on schedule, and I will keep you all updated regularly as progress is made. Fr Mark

## St Basil & All Saints: Local Ecumenical Partnership

Liverpool Diocese have always been blessed by the ecumenical relationship we share with the Archdiocese, and the opportunity to work together in the Local Ecumenical Partnership of St Basil and All Saints is just one example of how this relationship has been lived out in the local community for over four decades. Some remarkable work has taken place since this partnership was formed, and for this we remain thankful to those who held and developed the vision for such a partnership, benefiting both church and wider community.

However, the LEP is now 40 years old, and today we find ourselves facing new challenges amid significant pressure on finance and resources, none of which could have been foreseen when the LEP was first established in 1983.

To that end, All Saints PCC have concluded that it is no longer viable for them to continue, and I can confirm that we have now entered into a period of consultation and discussion with the Archdiocese to address All Saints withdrawal from the LEP. The decision has not been taken lightly, and while there is significant sadness, all parties agree this to be the best option. The process will take some time, and we are currently very much at the start of the conversation. Rev Peter Dawkin will be moving to a new post at St Luke Farnworth on the 23<sup>rd</sup> Sept, his final service in St Basil & All Saints being 22<sup>nd</sup>. All Saints will, however, remain part of the LEP until such a time as the withdrawal process is concluded.

I'm grateful for the opportunity to work on the process with Fr Mark and others, and equally grateful to the congregations of St Basil and All Saints, both past and present, for their faithful commitment to the LEP over so many years. I'm more than happy to have a conversation to answer any questions or concerns you may have.
