Connecting

I've thoroughly enjoyed our parish 'Early Riser' 7am Masses each Wednesday. Thank you to all who joined us. Being at Mass as dawn broke was truly inspirational. Experiencing dawn breaking and being at Mass led me to think about the connection between our faith and the natural world, God's creation. I've had various chances to think more deeply about this including lecturing on environmental topics, attending a professional conference on biodiversity and joining the Archdiocesan Environment Conference. These all brought into focus how easy it is to become jaded or tired in our appreciation of the wonderful gift of God's creation. Perhaps we don't take enough time to stop in our busy lives and take notice, to simply 'be' in the beauty of the natural world? Pondering this also reminded me how God's creation is getting an awfully bad deal from us, and yet it is so important. It is literally 'life giving'. Having reminders to connect with nature can really us help to appreciate this.

This Sunday is Palm Sunday. I have a beautifully made yet simple palm cross in the console of my car. It is a constant reminder of my faith and, being made of a natural material, how our faith helps us to value the gift of God's creation and all that it does for us. Let's think about palms.

Palms are a huge plant family that provide millions of people with food, drink and shelter. Palm trees have a host of uses, including as staple crops such as coconut, palm oil or dates, or in the making of furniture, rubber, oil and ropes. According to research published in the journal 'Nature Ecology and Evolution', at least 185 palm species that have a use may be threatened in 92 regions, emphasising the need to protect these plants. The data from this study suggests that more than a thousand species - just over 50% of palms - are threatened with extinction. When you hold your palms this week you are connecting with nature. Perhaps you might use this connection to reflect on how important God's creation is for us and what you can do to help it in your life choices?
