Reflection

As we enter the season of Advent, the Church proclaims: *Stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.* There was a moment in the evolution of humanity when our ancestors stopped scurrying around on all fours and stood up on two feet. Standing upright is what makes us human. It differentiates us from many of the other animals.

When life is hard, then we may let ourselves be bent down again, weighed down by the worries of life, unable to flourish as human beings. Whenever tyrants have wished to extinguish human dignity, they try to bring people down to the ground again. When the priest St Edmund Campion, for instance, was arrested in the reign of Elizabeth I, he was put in a cell in the Tower of London in which he was unable to stand upright.

When life seems to lose its meaning and we are feeling dejected and downcast, Jesus invites us to stand upright, to rediscover our dignity: our natural dignity as human beings and our supernatural dignity as children of God.

We can do this because, as the Gospel says, we await in hope the return of the Son of Man as King in glory at the end of time. Then we shall see God's final triumph over chaos and all that destroys human life and weighs us down.

The Advent wreath is a Christian tradition that symbolizes the passage of the four weeks of Advent

It is usually a horizontal evergreen wreath with four candles, sometimes with a fifth, white candle in the center, sometimes known as the 'Christ candle' which symbolises the arrival of Christmastide. This is usually lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.

The most popular colours for the four surrounding Advent candles are violet (purple) and rose, corresponding with the colors of the liturgical vestments for the Sundays of Advent.

Violet (purple) is the historic liturgical colour for three of the four Sundays of Advent: Violet (purple) is the traditional color of penitential seasons.

Rose is the liturgical color for the Third Sunday of Advent, known as Gaudete Sunday from the Latin word meaning "to rejoice". As such, the third candle, representing joy, is often a different color from the other three.

Beginning with the First Sunday of Advent, an additional candle is lit during each subsequent week until, by the last Sunday before Christmas, all four candles are lit.

Advent wreaths are circular, representing God's infinite love, and are usually made of evergreen leaves, which represent the hope of eternal life brought by Jesus Christ.

Within the Advent wreath are candles that generally represent the four weeks of the Advent season as well as the light of God coming into the world through the birth of Jesus Christ. Each of the candles has its own significance:

The first week of Advent: hope
The second week of Advent: peace
The third week of Advent: joy
The fourth week of Advent: love

St. Wilfrid's Advent Appeal - 2021

So often we buy gifts for people who don't really need them! Socks and scarves that are very nice but not really needed! As Christians we are called to see Advent as a real time of waiting in hope, a time of reflection and prayer and a time of showing our faith in caring for those in need. This year we are going to help asylum seekers, refugees, and vulnerable migrants by giving them a gift that **IS** desperately needed.

All items must be NEW as they are a Christmas gift. If you would like to buy a gift, you simply take a 'Christmas Label' from the back of Church, with an item that is needed and return it with the label attached. This stops us all buying the same things!

Gifts can be left (please do not wrap them) at the back of all the churches during Advent.

(Last date for donations is Sunday 19th December)

Men's underwear – sizes small and medium, Socks – sizes 6 – 12, Warm hats, gloves, and scarves (male and female)

Training shoes – male sizes 6-10, Women's underwear – sizes 10-16

Small electrical items – toaster, kettles, blender, juicer (if the receipt could be attached to these items it would be a great help), Small and medium pans, Pillows, and pillowcases.

Sacristans/Flower Arrangers/Church Cleaners

We are in the business of keeping everyone safe, especially people who come into our churches. So that we can do this better we are asking people who come into church to carry out tasks such as the above to do certain things...

- Ensure the parish office has a 'person to contact' name and telephone number, so that we can contact them if we need to.
- * On entering the church sign in and on leaving sign out, so that we can see when you were in the church building.
- Inform someone, a friend or relative if you are going to church at a time when you wouldn't usually go and let them know when you have returned.
- Try and keep to the same time and day that you come into church to fulfil your role and duties, so that we have an idea of when you are coming and going.
- * If you ever feel unsafe carrying out your role, let Fr. Bill or Fr. Mark know, this does not mean that your role will cease, it may just mean that your role will be adapted, or assistance given.
- * Try not to be in church alone.
- * Let us know if we can do anything to make you feel safer in the role that you carry out for the good of us all, speak up!
