Clad in high visibility jacket and hard hat, I had a sneak peak of the progress of the Restoration Project thus far. Safe to say, things are moving ahead at good pace and no massive problems have been encountered as yet, thank God. Apart from the vantage point views of the Mersey Estuary, Fiddlers Ferry Power Station and indeed Saint Michael's Tower, I was also able to see the severely deteriorated state of the stonework and mortar all-round the Church. Saint Bede's is certainly in want of some TLC. Our Architect said to me "Fr Peter, we are intervening at the right time, before things begin to deteriorate rapidly".

While we are often and rightly reminded of the fact that 'we are the Church', we would do well to remember that human beings have consistently cooperated with God in building temples for his dwelling on earth. From David and Solomon, who lived thousands of years ago, right through to our work at Saint Bede's in Widnes, God has consistently chosen to dwell in buildings erected to his worship. Saint Bede's Church is a visible witness to God's abiding love for humanity, the God who pitched His tent among us.

Our work seeks to prolong that visible witness for generations to come. Each playing a part, no matter how great or small, at the end of this project, may we all be able to address the Lord, reechoing Solomon; "I have indeed made You an exalted house, a place for You to dwell forever" (1 Kings 8:13).
