Taizé - a way of praying

You may have noticed on the Parish Liturgy page of the Newsletter an item that announced a Taizé Prayer Service at St Basil's church. It has appeared twice over the months. I was invited to both and want to spread the word. Taizé, in eastern France near the Swiss border, is one of those places I would like to have visited, but never got round to it. It is a very large ecumenical monastic community of not far off a hundred men, Catholics, Anglicans, Protestants and others.

It was founded in 1940 by Brother Roger as a place of safety for those fleeing the Nazis. Eventually, the authorities caught up with what was going on and he fled back to his native Switzerland. When it was safe to do so, he reopened at Taizé. In 1949, seven men joined him to live a life in the footsteps of Jesus in simplicity, celibacy and community. The first Catholic, a Belgian doctor, joined in 1969.

By 2005, Taizé was world renowned, sending small groups of its monks to support communities in many countries. In fact, it's monks hail from thirty different countries. But in that year, the very elderly Br. Roger was murdered by a person with a mental illness. His funeral was a wonderfully ecumenical occasion with ten thousand people present. Cardinal Kasper, Head of the Commission for Church Unity, presided. Bishop Nigel McCulloch, then Bishop of Manchester, represented Rohan Williams of Canterbury, the President of Germany was there, the Orthodox churches were present.

Nowadays, Taizé is a great centre for Youth Pilgrimages. Perhaps a hundred thousand youngsters a year attend for a week at a time. Prayer, Bible Study and Work. And Taizé has contributed to devotion everywhere, especially with its sung chants. We occasionally sing one at Communion. And those sung chants form the meditative background to the St Basil's Prayer Service, along with spoken prayer and scripture readings, but it is the music that is distinctive, and it is St. Basil's music makers who have initiated these Services for us. God bless them.
