# Dilexi Te - Pope Leo XIV's first Apostolic Exhortation

Pope Leo has issued his first Apostolic Exhortation, *Dilexi Te* (I have loved you), on love for the poor. This document, begun by Pope Francis and completed by Pope Leo, stands in succession to Francis' last letter, *Dilexit Nos* (he loved us), on the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The two letters demonstrate the close connection between God and the poor, for it is in the wounded faces of the poor that we see Christ himself. Here are a few key extracts:

- 10. In this sense, it can be said that the commitment to the poor and to removing the social and structural causes of poverty has gained importance in recent decades, but it remains insufficient.
- 19. The Gospel shows us that poverty marked every aspect of Jesus' life. From the moment he entered the world, Jesus knew the bitter experience of rejection.
- 75. The Church's tradition of working for and with migrants continues, and today this service is expressed in initiatives such as refugee reception centres, border missions and the efforts of Caritas Internationalis and other institutions.
- 97. All the members of the People of God have a duty to make their voices heard, albeit in different ways, in order to point out and denounce such structural issues, even at the cost of appearing foolish or naïve.
- 121. Through your work, your efforts to change unjust social structures or your simple, heartfelt gesture of closeness and support, the poor will come to realize that Jesus' words are addressed personally to each of them: "I have loved you" (Rev 3:9).
