Reflection

Pope Francis is just home from a visit to Greece, Cyprus and the island of Lesbos, where so many migrants are housed. He has been to Lesbos before, with the Orthodox Archbishop of Athens, Leader of the Greek Orthodox Church, Hieronymos.He was visiting the relatively small Catholic communities in Greece and Cyprus, but a visit to Hieronymos was an important part of the trip.

Pope Francis says it as it is and recognised that there was need for the Catholic Church to apologise for its part in the thousand year old division between West and East in the Church, and for helping sustain and at times deepen the division. So, he apologised, strongly. And the apology was noted in a big way.

Inevitably, on the plane back to Rome a journalist asked about apologising. Francis went on a bit, but essentially said that the divisions were not one sided and we Catholics needed to apologise for the part we had played over the thousand years of that division.

But he went on to talk about apology. Asking God's forgiveness is not hard because we know that God says "Yes, go on, you are forgiven", but asking forgiveness of human beings is very different because of the shame and humiliation associated with it and not knowing how it will be received.

But today's world is so full of wars, lives lost and so many other dreadful things that we need the ability to accept the humiliation which may be associated with acknowledging any part we as individuals, as communities or as nations play in that suffering.

If I may add, putting ourselves in that situation is the work of the Holy Spirit, and it is strength, not weakness, in an individual, a community or a nation.


A big thank you to everybody who supported our Christmas Bingo.
